ACTIVITY 1 – INTRODUCTORY ACTIVITY

MAKE IT FUN

INTRODUCTORY ACTIVITY | PEOPLE WHO HELP ME

What You Need: Paper, markers, and wall tape

What You Do:

Hang the paper on the wall with the wall tape. At the top of the page, write “People Who Help Me” in large block letters. Gather the children to sit in front of the butcher paper and name people who help them. Write their answers on the butcher paper.

What You Say:

“I need your help. Come sit in front of this paper. I want you to think of someone who helps you. I want you to name someone who helps you, and I’ll write it on the paper. Let’s see, there are a lot of people who help us! There’s *(read all the names on the list)*. Tell me, who gave us all these people to help us? *(Pause.)* Yes, God did! God gives us GOOD things like people who help us. Why? Because He is good. **Who is good? [Bottom Line] God is good.**”

APPLICATION ACTIVITY | WALL PUZZLE

What You Need: “Wall Puzzle” Activity Page, scissors, and crayons

What You Do:

During the Activity: Give each child their own puzzle. Let them color the puzzle. After they are done coloring, start to cut out the puzzle. Place the wall puzzles in the activity area. Be sure they are not put together. Encourage the children to put the puzzles together while you say the memory verse.

What You Say:

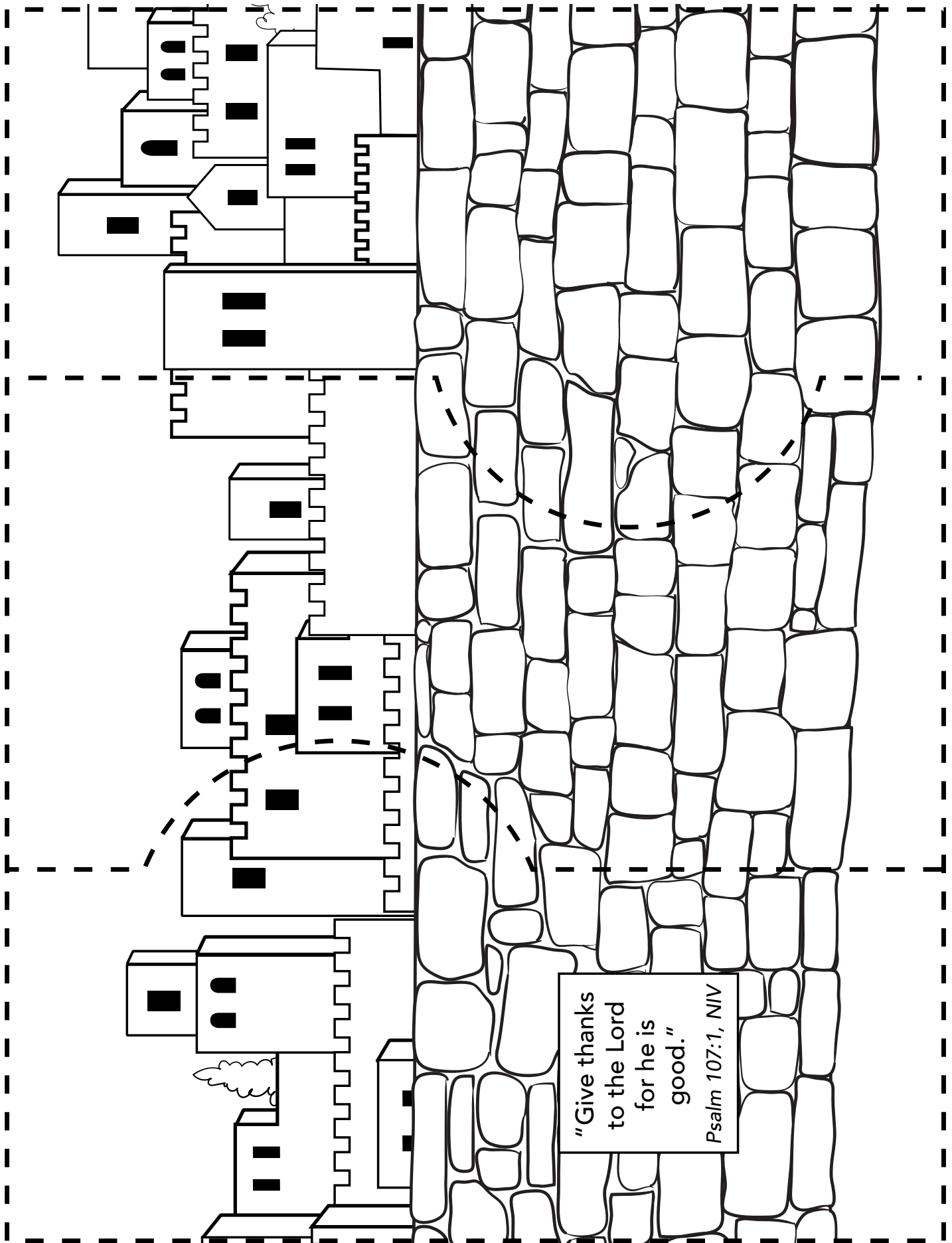
Before the Activity: “Let’s do puzzles! “(Point.)
